

## Guidelines to Contributors

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While submitting the MS, membership of Indian Society of Seed Technology of every author is to be ensured. If not, you are required to fulfill the membership requirements simultaneously in correspondence with the "Secretary, ISST. The title should be informative. The name of the authors and of the institution, where the work was carried out should follow the title. Authors should mention their e-mail address, which may be given after postal address and followed by abstract of not more than 200 words indicating the main findings of the paper. The paper should have the main headings as - Short Title, Title, Abstract, Keywords, Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion and References.

- Periodicals should not be abbreviated.

Tables & figures should be given separately, after the reference section and should not be inserted within the text, but must be referred with data in text. All figures, with proper legends/labels, should be submitted in JPEG format with high resolution quality. On the top of the first page, a short/running title of less than 40 characters need to be provided.

When a paper is finally accepted, authors should submit the final corrected version in MS word, as an e-mail\*1 attachment.

**AUTHORS SHOULD CONSULT A RECENT ISSUE OF THE 'Seed Research or VISIT ISST WEBSITE FOR GUIDELINES BEFORE TYPING AND FOLLOW THE FORMAT STRICTLY.**

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- ✓ The research work should not have been carried out five years prior to the date of submission of full length paper(s) and or short communication(s).
- ✓ All the headings and subheadings, tables, figures and references are correct and as per journal format.
- ✓ Manuscript has been 'spell-checked' and 'grammar checked' (Preferably American)

### **Introduction:**

- ✓ Is the problem/hypothesis stated clearly?
- ✓ Is there sufficient (and relevant) theoretical background?
- ✓ Are the relevant and latest references cited correctly?

### **Materials and Methods:**

- ✓ Is it possible to repeat this study using the methods described?
- ✓ Are the dates and locations given?
- ✓ Are the numbers in metric?
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- ✓ Are the data in tables are grouped and figures saved in  $\geq 300$ dpi?
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- ✓ Were the results of statistical tests given?
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- ✓ Are results related to the hypothesis?
- ✓ Are relevant and latest references cited correctly?

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- ✓ Are all the references listed have been mentioned in text [bracket] as per sequence of first appearance in text?

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
