Guidelines to Contributors

Seed Research publishes original papers and review articles in all areas of seed science viz. production, sampling, testing, processing, physiology, entomology, pathology, storage, marketing, etc. Two issues per year are published. Authors are requested to submit their manuscripts online in English at article submission, www.isst-india.com, strictly in the format of the Journal. Strict compliance with ethical standards should be practiced before submitting a manuscript. Authors can also send their word file of manuscript and jpeg file of photos and figures through e-mail to ceseedres@gmail.com as attachment. On receipt of manuscript, an acknowledgement along with registration number is sent to the corresponding author. This number should always be quoted while making further enquiry about the manuscript. All correspondence regarding the manuscript should be addressed to the Chief Editor, Indian Society of Seed Technology, A Block, F-5, First Floor, NASC Complex, D.P.S. Marg, IARI P.O., Pusa Campus, New Delhi 110 012.

While submitting the MS, membership of Indian Society of Seed Technology of every author is to be ensured. If not, you are required to fulfill the membership requirements simultaneously in correspondence with the "Secretary, ISST. The title should be informative. The name of the authors and of the institution, where the work was carried out should follow the title. Authors should mention their e-mail address, which may be given after postal address and followed by abstract of not more than 200 words indicating the main findings of the paper. The paper should have the main headings as - Short Title, Title, Abstract, Keywords, Introduction, Materials and Methods, Results, Discussion and References.

Tables & figures should be given separately, after the reference section and should not be inserted within the text, but must be referred with data in text. All figures, with proper legends/labels, should be submitted in JPEG format with high resolution quality. On the top of the first page, a short/running title of less than 40 characters need to be provided.

When a paper is finally accepted, authors should submit the final corrected version in MS word, as an e-mail*1 attachment.

AUTHORS SHOULD CONSULT A RECENT ISSUE OF THE 'Seed Research or VISIT ISST WEBSITE FOR GUIDELINES BEFORE TYPING AND FOLLOW THE FORMAT STRICTLY.

Proofs will be sent to authors for correction. Although every effort is made by the editors to correct the proof, they assume no responsibility for any error that may remain in the final printing.

Checks for submission of MS

- ✓ All the authors (contributors), individually or corresponding author on her or his/ their behalf (after seeking written consent along with signature) has to submit a signed undertaking for agreeing to all the terms and conditions of ISST publications.
 - The authors should declare that they do not have any conflict of interest.
- ✓ The research work should not have been carried out five years prior to the date of submission of full length paper(s) and or short communication(s).
- ✓ All the headings and subheadings, tables, figures and references are correct and as per journal format.
- ✓ Manuscript has been 'spell-checked' and 'grammar checked' (Preferably American)

Introduction:

- ✓ Is the problem/hypothesis stated clearly?
- ✓ Is there sufficient (and relevant) theoretical background?
- ✓ Are the relevant and latest references cited correctly?

Materials and Methods:

- ✓ Is it possible to repeat this study using the methods described?
- ✓ Are the dates and locations given?
- ✓ Are the numbers in metric?
- ✓ Is the international system of dates and times used?
- ✓ Are relevant and latest references cited correctly?

Results and Discussion:

- ✓ Are the data in tables are grouped and figures saved in ≥300dpi?
- ✓ Do the figures have self- explanatory legends?
- ✓ Are all the axes in graphs labelled?
- ✓ Are these properly/orderly numbered and referred in text?
- ✓ Are the results presented in prose?
- ✓ Are the figures/tables referred to in the text?
- ✓ Were the results of statistical tests given?
- ✓ Whether the results have been interpreted properly or not, rather than merely restated?
- ✓ Are results related to the hypothesis?
- ✓ Are relevant and latest references cited correctly?

- ✓ Are citations in the proper format?
- ✓ Are all the references listed have been mentioned in text [bracket] as per sequence of first appearance in text?

Authors must submit an undertaking that there was no conflict of interests, the work was conducted ethically and it does not violate copyrights.
